

COVID-19 Day Camp Policies

Daily Check-In Procedures for Campers and Volunteers:

Upon arrival, before a camper exits a car, they will have their temperature taken via a temporal thermometer through an open window of the car. Campers with a temperature of 100.3°F or higher will not be allowed to attend camp. Personal temperatures will not be shared. When girls are exiting the car, they will be asked to use some hand sanitizer. **Parents should not drive away until their camper has been cleared to attend camp for the day.** Walk in campers and volunteers will go through the same process. Once cleared, girls will meet at their unit site flag and have to maintain at least 3' of distance during the opening flag ceremony.

Cleaning and Handwashing:

All camp attendees will be asked to wash their hands with soap/water frequently throughout the day. In addition, hand sanitizer will be used when they arrive in the morning and before/after sharing any materials at camp. While every effort will be made to have each camper have their own supplies, sometimes it is impossible to provide one item per camper (for example, when a unit site leads a flag ceremony or when a unit site has to refill their water bottles at the water pumps). Toilets and latrines will be cleaned twice each morning by an assigned camp unit. Disposable masks and gloves will be made available for all individuals for this assignment.

Apparel:

All camp attendees will be required to wear a face mask over their nose and mouth while they are at camp. Attendees should also carry with them in a sealed plastic bag, an additional face mask to be used as a back-up. All attendees must wear proper clothing, including their camp t-shirt, closed-toe shoes, and weather appropriate gear at camp.

Unit Size:

Day camp units will be limited to an absolute maximum of 10 girls per unit for Daisy/Brownie, Junior, and Rookie Aide units. The Teen unit will be limited to a maximum of 12 girls each. Each unit will also include two adults. Daisy/Brownie and Junior units will include one Aide. On Thursday and Friday of each week, the Daisy/Brownie units will also include two Rookie Aides.

Thunder and Lightning:

If a parent is concerned that it might storm, they are welcome to keep their camper home for the day. However, if a camper stays home for the day, they will be unable to access any virtual programming and will simply be counted absent for the day. Due to time limitations, there won't be any opportunities throughout the week to make up missed activities.

Volunteers:

Volunteers who determine they are unable to attend camp on any day due to suspected COVID-19 illness will not be allowed to return for the remainder of the week. In addition, any campers who reside with that volunteer will be unable to attend camp for the remainder of the week. Campers will be not be able to access virtual programming.

Sessions Changes and Refunds:

Session changes are not permitted. Campers may not switch between Session 1 and Session 2, nor may they switch between "in-person" and "virtual" camping. Once a camper is enrolled, the selection is final. There will be no tuition refunds for any reason.
